The prophets were the truth-sayers of their day.

They were willing to say difficult things—at times to kings, sometimes to religious leaders, and still at other times to the entire community when the community was unfaithful to the Lord God. In our own time, we continue to need those who speak the truth to us. While it is not always pleasant, it is a grace to have people in our lives who smooth out our rough edges. Spouses can be that for one another. Parents are that for their children, as they teach, correct, and discipline in ways that nurture the young ones into adult-hood. Presidents need someone willing to say difficult things to them, as do pastors of parishes and anyone in a position of responsibility.

Sometimes social movements rise up and call our attention to injustices that need to be addressed. Those voices can be prophet-like in our own time. The Church is such a voice when it advocates for the protection of the unborn, the immigrant, and those oppressed. The civil rights movement is such a voice in the face of violence and injustice to people of color. There are voices who call the Catholic Church to be accountable for abuse. Scientists call on us to pay attention to the environment. Whenever and wherever truth-sayers call human beings to become their better selves, there lies the Spirit of God raising a prophetic voice.


Please Welcome New Additions to The "Little Church in the Woods"



Good Shepherd Church Mass Changes

Starting July 1, 2024

Dear Good Shepherd Family Member,

It is a great joy to be named the Parish Administrator of Good Shepherd. As you know my first encounter with this special place was during my college years. Many of my friends were coming to this great "new" parish in Holbrook! Since coming here in 2009, I have always felt at home and among friends. This is a place where I can preach from my heart! When I was reassigned and sent elsewhere, my prayer was always that *maybe* the Lord would find a way to bring me back! God truly writes straight with crooked lines! I am truly so grateful...

One of the first challenges I have been asked to evaluate is the change in clergy personnel here at Good Shepherd. Just a short time ago, there were four priests living in residence to serve the needs of our people. Now there are two! While we have discussed these coming changes in the past, we are now faced with the reality in the here and now. The Diocese has asked me to make reductions in the Mass Schedule so that the entire Parish can be served in the best way possible. While some recommended deep cuts, we have decided at this time to make just a few tweaks to our Mass Schedule. As you will see on the reverse side of this card, we chose to merge the first two masses (7:00am & 8:30am) into one 8:00am Mass. This reduces the schedule while still serving the needs of those who enjoy an early morning liturgy. There are some other minor changes which you will notice in the schedule as well.

For those who have Mass intentions for the 7:00am or the 8:30am, please contact the office at your convenience. You will be offered three choices to re-book your intention for Mass. First you may be offered a slot in the new 8:00am Mass. Second you can choose to have your intention honored at the 10:00am Mass Guild Collective Masses. Third, you can ask for your donation back and book a mass at a later date. We realize this means some adjustments in your regular schedule and we ask for your patience and understanding.

We are looking forward to working with Joe as he brings his strong Administrative qualifications and life-long knowledge to our Staff.




